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# Arabic Root System 1/2

- Arabic is a semitic language
- All words are derived from a “root”
- “Root” is a set of consonants
- Mostly from 3 radicals

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# Arabic Root System 2/2

- Patterns are derived from the “root”
- Arabic is based on patterns
- Ease the learning of vocabulary

# English ?

- Example of patterns in English :

necessary	<i>adjective</i>
unnecessary	<i>neg. adjective</i>
necessitate	<i>verb</i>
necessarily	<i>adverb</i>
necessity	<i>noun</i>

- Combination of “necess”
  - root meaning = “needing”

# Arabic ?

- Example of patterns in Arabic :

<i>he wrote</i>	كَتَبَ
<i>a book</i>	كِتَاب
<i>an office</i>	مَكْتَب
<i>a library</i>	مَكْتَبَةٌ
<i>he writes</i>	يَكْتُبُ
<i>a writer</i>	كَاتِب
<i>sth. written</i>	مَكْتُوب

- Combination of ك - ت - ب

# Root letters

- There are 3 radicals, mostly

ك - ت - ب

- 1st radical = ك
- 2nd radical = ت
- 3rd radical = ب

*Order must be respected*

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# Usage

- Learn vocabulary quickly
  - Memorize only the “root” meaning
  - Learn the meaning of derived pattern
  - Adding letters to the base “root”
- Use Arabic dictionary
  - like Hans Wehr / Milton Cowan
