Unit ۱۹ - Past tense - کان

الفعل المعروف - Active

خَلَقَ ٱللّهُ ٱلْإنسَانَا

Allah created mankind

- 3 components:
 - a) subject = Allah
 - b) (active) verb = created
 - c) object = mankind

Passive - الفعل المجهول المجهول



Mankind was created

English: Mankind was created "by Allah"

Arabic: this construction does not exist

- 2 components:
- a) (passive) verb = was created
- b) object = mankind ⇒ subject acted upon

Preference noun

 A noun used to compare another noun in quality or quantity - i.e. superiority


2 types:

- a) Comparative
- b) Superlative
- on the pattern of اَفْعَلُ
- this pattern is "diptote", no tanween

Comparative

2 nouns are compared:

- the first noun is greater in quality or quantity than the second noun
- particle من is used to compare



Preferred to Preference Preferred

noun

Comparative

Another example:



Preference noun Preferred

- Here مِن and "Preferred to" are omitted
- Literally means : "Allah is Greater" => but greater than what?
- So, rendered as "Allah is the Greatest"

Superlative

Express the highest degree of comparison:

- one is superior against all others
- اً فعل to الله Prefixing article

حَامِدٌ الأكْبَرُ

Hamid is the greatest

Superlative

2. Genitive noun following اَفْعَل

فَاطِمَةُ أَحْسَنُ طَالِبَةٍ

Fatimah is the best student

Note: أَحْسَنُ: is invariant for masc. and femn.

But اَلاَحْسَنُ is for masc. and الكُسْنَى is for femn.

Superlative

3. Possessive phrase (الإضافة)

the Best Judge of all judges

the Most Merciful of the merciful

the lowest of the low

the lowest of the low


Diminutive

• On the pattern of فعيلُ

زَهُر \ زُهُيرَ	هَر ۱ هُرَيرَة
سُلَيْمَان ؟	إبن \ بني
سَلْمَان	عبد \ عبيد

کان - Verb

- It is used <u>only</u> in a nominal sentence
 - change its declension/case (إعراب)
- The sentence remains nominal sentence although it begins with the verb کَانَ
- The أُسُمُ كَانَ is called مُبْتَدَاً (Noun)
 - and is in nominative
- The خَبَرُ كَانَ is called خَبَرُ كَانَ (Predicate)
 - and is in accusative



Allah // is [always] // ever Knowing // Wise 12

کان - Verb

- کَبر relates the subject to the کان
- If خُبُر is a Prepositional phrase, it remains in Genitive
- حَبَر can be a verbal sentence

He was playing in the garden

Tenses / Moods

Past	کُانَ	He was
Present	یکُونُ	He is
Imperative	کُن	Be!

کان - Verb
